Long term overexposure to propylene glycol caused liver abnormalities, kidney damage in laboratory animals. Repeated excessive ingestion may cause central nervous system effects. Overexposure to sublimed zinc oxide may produce symptoms known as "zinc oxide chills" which have no recognized complications. Symptoms usually disappear within 24 hours. Fillers are encapsulated and not expected to be released from product under normal conditions of use.
